

Drawing 1 - Fixture Mounting




- 1. Find a clear area in which you can work.
 - 2. Unpack fixture and glass from carton.
 - 3. Carefully review instructions prior to assembly.

*** The construction of this fixture will be accomplished by first assembling the main body of the fixture, mounting the mounting strap to the junction box, making all necessary electrical connections, mounting the fixture to the wall, and then installing the glass.

- 1. To assemble main body, remove ball knobs (A) from backplate (C) and remove retainer plate (G) - see Drawing 2.
- 2. Remove appropriate knock outs from the star pattern on the retainer plate (G) that match the mounting hole location on your junction box (B).
- 3. Slip wire from junction box (B) through the 9/16" dia. access hole in the retainer plate (G).
- 4. Mount retainer plate (G) to the junction box (B) using 8-32 screws (S) (not provided).
- 5. The top and bottom ends of the retainer plate have additional attachments points that can be used. To attach the plate at these points use the wood screws (D) provided.


Make electrical connections from supply wire to fixture lead wires. Refer to instruction sheet (I.S. 18) and follow all instructions to make all necessary wiring connections. Then refer back to this sheet to continue installation of this fixture.

- 1. Mount the fixture to the wall by slipping holes (E) in backplate (C), over screws (F) in retainer plate (G) and securing with ball knobs (A) - see Drawing 1.
- 1. Prior to installing glass, fixture can now be lamped accordingly.
- 2. To install glass, first slip glass (1) oover cluster body (5) and rest it on glass fitter (2) - see Drawing 2.
- 3. Now slip spider (S) into glass and onto top of cluster body (5).
- 4. Now slip threaded end of center stem (3) through center hole in spider (5) and thread into top of cluster assembly (5) and tighten to secure bottom of glass.
- 5. Slide crown (4) onto center stem (3), making sure to line up cap (7) with attach-
- 6. Thread knurled cap (7) to backplate (C) at attachment point (6).
- 7. Tighten secondary knurled cap (9) against knurled cap (7) to secure arm (8) in place.
- 8. Thread top finial (10) onto center stem (3).


- **1.** Due to the weight of this fixture, it has a safety cable (C), that is attached to the inside of the backplate.
- 2. This safety cable (C) is to be attached to the joist that supports the junction box (J) the fixture will be installed on.
- **3.** It is up to the the customer to determine and purchase the hardware necessary to attach the safety cable.



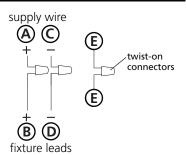
Drawing 1 - Flush Mount

wiring instructions

Indoor Fixtures

- 1. Connect positive supply wire (A) (typically black or the smooth, unmarked side of the two-conductor cord) to positive fixture lead (B) with appropriately sized twist on connector - see Drawings 1 or 2.
- 2. Connect negative supply wire (C) (typically white or the ribbed, marked side of the two-conductor cord) to negative fixture lead (D).
- 3. Please refer to the **grounding instructions** below to complete all electrical connections.

Outdoor Fixtures

- 1. Connect positive supply wire (A) (typically black or the smooth unmarked side of the two-conductor cord) to positive fixture lead (B) with appropriately sized twist on connector - see Drawings 2 or 3.
- 2. Connect negative supply wire (C) (typically white or the ribbed, marked side of the two-conductor cord) to negative fixture lead (D).
- 3. Cover open end of connectors with silicone sealant to form a watertight seal.
- If installing a wall mount fixture, use caulk to seal gaps between the fixture mounting plate (backplate) and the wall. This will help prevent water from entering the outlet box. If the wall surface is lap siding, use caulk and a fixture mounting platform specially.
- 4. Please refer to the grounding instructions below to complete all electrical connections.

grounding instructions

Flush Mount Fixtures

For positive grounding in a 3-wire electrical system, fasten the fixture ground wire (E) (typically copper or green plastic coated) to the fixture mounting strap (1) with the ground screw (2) - see Drawing 1.

Note: On straps for screw supported fixtures, first install the two mounting screws in strap. Any remaining tapped hole may be used for the ground screw.

Chain Hung Fixtures

Loop fixture ground wire (E) (typically copper or green plastic coated) under the head of the ground screw (2) on fixture mounting strap (1) and connect to the loose end of the fixture ground wire directly to the ground wire of the building system with appropriately sized twist-on connectors - see Drawing 2.

Post-Mount Fixtures


Connect fixture ground wire (E) (typically copper or green plastic coated) to power supply ground with appropriately sized twist-on connector inside post. Cover open end of connector with silicone sealant to form a watertight seal - see Drawing 3.

1. After securing fixture to the wall it is recommended that the gap between the wall and fixture backplate be sealed with any good quality waterproof caulk or silicone sealant. (NOT INCLUDED) See Drawing 1.

1. After securing fixture in place it is recommended that the gap between the mounting top and fixture base be sealed with any good quality waterproof caulk or silicone sealant. (NOT INCLUDED). It is also recommended that a small bead of caulk or sealant be put under the ball knobs used to mount fixture. See Drawing 2.
